Highlights of the Month



We suggest that you begin by turning to the first text that outlines the [results and impacts of the Bolsa Familia Program education and health conditionalities monitoring process](#) and the key role that this plays in PBF's strategy for dealing with poverty. The Program currently monitors school attendance by 90% of the students benefiting from

the PBF and the health situation of 73% of the beneficiary families with children and pregnant women.

This is followed by a piece on the consequences of [non-compliance with the conditionalities](#) by beneficiary families and the social work undertaken with those who fail to comply.

Take a look also at the main results and impacts of the [education](#) and [health](#) conditionalities on the low income families benefiting from the PBF. To add weight to this discussion we were able to draw upon data based on a survey of a wide range of technical materials on the **impacts** of the Bolsa Familia Program, such as its contribution to **vaccination coverage**, to the reduction of **infant mortality** rates among beneficiary families and to the decline of grade repetition and **drop-out rates**.
